

Service Guidelines and Requirements



Calling & Character

- Our desire is that those who serve at Parkland Chapel to feel that they are “called” to the ministry at hand.
- Participants must be born-again believers of Christ, and their lifestyle must resemble that of a born-again Christian, at all times (church, work, home, community, etc.).

Commitment

- Parkland Chapel does not have formal “membership”. If you are a believer in Christ and have attended regularly for 6 months, you are considered a member. Parkland Chapel members who serve should be actively involved and dedicated to Parkland Chapel’s vision and to the leadership of its pastor and other leaders. This commitment includes prayer, regular attendance, and tithes/offerings.
- Those who commit to serving may be asked to attend occasional team meetings or rehearsals (i.e. quarterly) and should do their best to make sure other commitments do not interfere with their ability to serve.

Attendance and Punctuality

- Attendance and punctuality are very important factors for serving on any Parkland Chapel team.
- Poor attendance and showing up late demonstrate a lack of discipline and respect for the ministry.

New Applicants and Waiting Periods

- Applicants are required to attend regularly for six months before they will be considered to serve.

Communication

- If at any time, a member cannot attend a service, rehearsal, etc. they must notify their team leader in advance if at all possible so that proper adjustments can be made. Lastly, open communication is of vital importance. If at any time a member is confused, discouraged, or unhappy with the way things may be happening at a given time, they are encouraged to speak with their team leader.
